INTRODUCTION

Alaska has a long and intimate history with rabies. There have been 3 confirmed human rabies cases in the State, with *many* confirmed cases of rabies in an assortment of different mammals through the years. The rabies virus can cause acute encephalitis in all warm-blooded hosts, including pets, wildlife and humans; the outcome of an infection is almost always fatal. In Alaska, rabies is endemic (*always* present) The following services and activities are included
